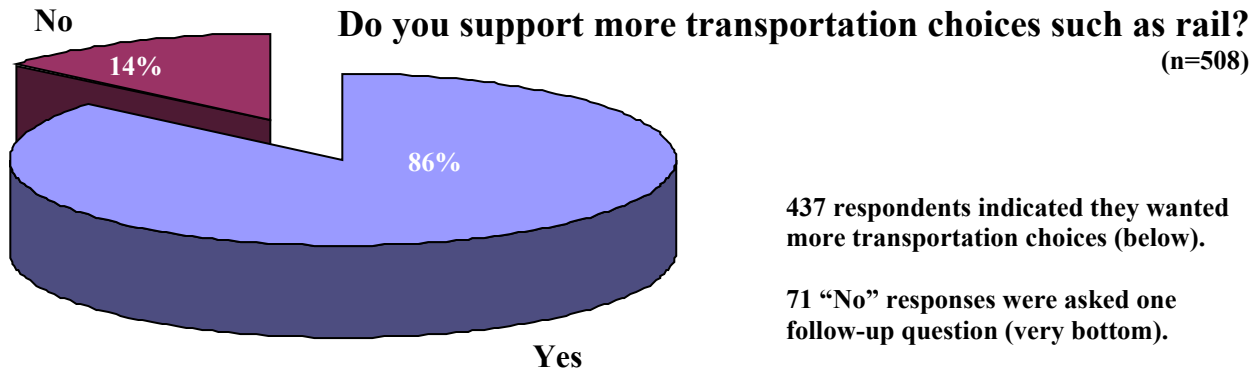




Newly formed, the *Alliance* is a non-partisan, nonprofit organization whose mission is to contribute to the economic vitality, quality of life,

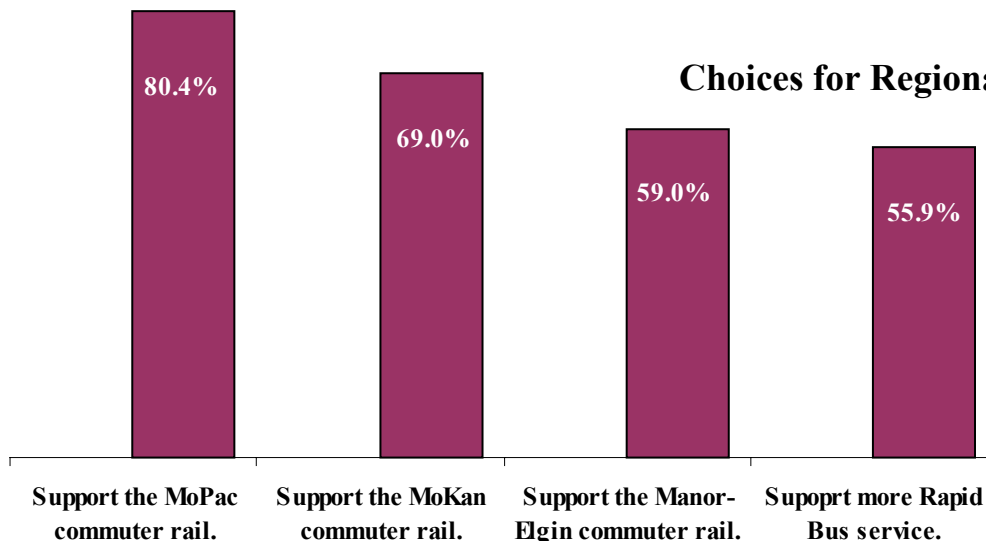
affordability, and the environment by promoting public transportation as a part of a balanced multi-modal transportation network. A diverse collaboration of businesses and community organizations, the *Alliance* seeks to identify and build a unified voice for the mobility choices which residents of Bastrop, Caldwell, Hayes, Travis, and Williamson counties want.

To take a temperature reading on the level of support for transportation options, UT students canvassed early voters on May 6th and voters at heavily trafficked Austin polling sites during the May 13th general election. Canvassers asked each voter *whether he/she support more transportation choices such as rail*. For voters who agreed, each was shown a board with visuals (e.g., route maps and photographs) of transportation options and asked to *select those he/she wanted to see more of*. Voters who responded that they did not support more transportation choices were asked to identify their concerns. Canvassers gathered input from 508 voters, roughly 25% of the turnout at these sites.



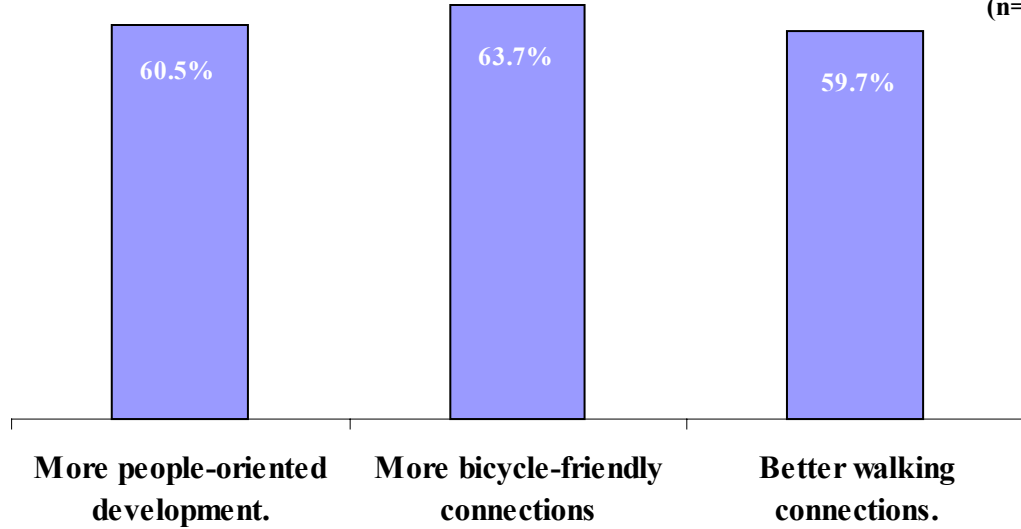
Downtown Circulator

61.4% of respondents want to see more downtown circulator services including on street rail. (n=425)



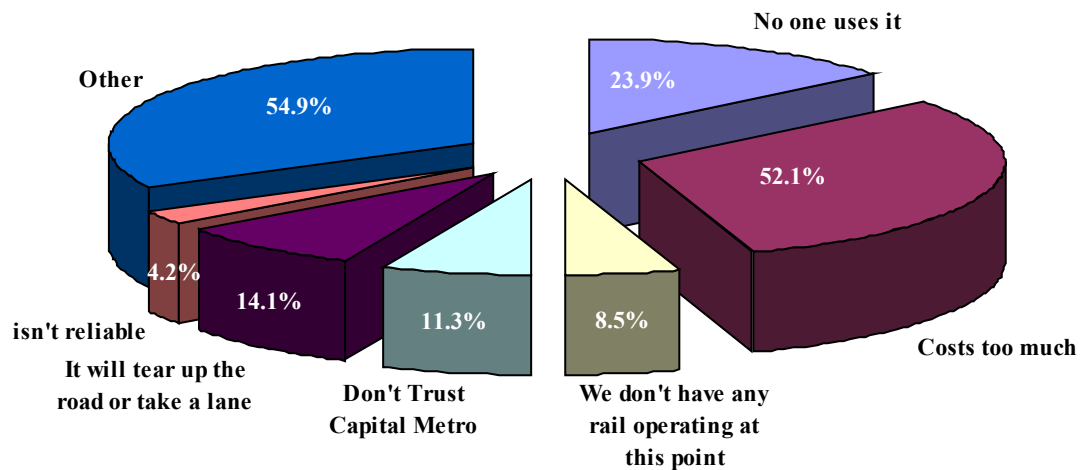
Choices for Connecting with Public Transportation
